and County. do make this my last will &
testament, revoking all others heretofore made
by me.

I desire for my body burial suitable
to my circumstances in life. My soul I
commend to God in hope of a joyful
resurrection.

I do desire that all my just debts be paid
by my executors as soon as possible within

by each one hand the allotment of same
And my wife by the sale of each property as
my Executors may at Judge's Dis.

3rd I give and bequeath - with payment of debts -
the whole of my property, real and personal,
to my beloved wife Charlotte, for her own
proper use, benefit and support, for and during
her natural life. I further more ob-
serve, that as soon as my said wife should at
any time, wish to be freed from the labor
and responsibility of housekeeping, then
upon my Executors - within their discretion -
shall be power to sell, or to lease or any part of
my property. But I direct that the so in-
vested proceeds thereof, that interest may
be immediately accruing; and that such
interest shall come to the principals, or such
part thereof as may be necessary, be
applied to the support and maintenance
of my said wife, provided nevertheless
that no part of the property so bequeathed,
shall ever become subject to my debt,
for which my said wife may become security.

4th At the death of my wife I desire that
of the property herein before bequeathed, or
the remainder of any, a sufficient amount be
reserved for and appropriated to the tuition of
a Sea school, over the name of myself, my
wife, and my deceased daughter Mary G.
That One hundred dollars be paid to
each of my children, James C. Francis H.
(wife Dr. Wm. C. Brickell) and Charlotte J. C. (wife
of C. C. Barnick), and that the remainder of
any, be equally divided amongst my chil-
dren, viz. Henry C. Jones, F. James C. Fran-
ces H. (wife of Dr. Wm. C. Brickell) and Charlotte
J. C. (wife of C. C. Barnick). The last two
shares, including the one hundred dollars
bequeathed, to the said Francis H. (wife of

the said Dr. Wm. C. Brickell) and said Charlotte J.
(wife of said C. C. Barnick) to be trust estates for
the benefit of my said daughter and their children
if or from the debts of their present or any fu-
ture husbands.

5th I appoint my wife, Executors and my
son Henry C. Jones Executors of this my last
will and Testament. This 4th January 1853.
