my last will and testament in the following manner hereby rev-
oking all former wills heretofore made by me

Item 1. It is my will and desire that my body be buried in a
grave and a Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances in
life.

Item 2. It is my will and desire that all my just debts be
paid as soon after my death as possible.

Item 3. I will and bequeath to my daughter Mary Morgan
girl Martha Ann and all my household and kitchen furniture
It is my desire if the hire of the above described negro's are
not sufficient for Mary support that the Executor use his dis-
cretion as to selling one of the negroes.

Item 4. I will and bequeath to my son John Morgan in
trust for the sole and separate use of Mary Ke Barnett during her
life and at her death to her body have one third of my estate
after carrying out Item third.

Item 5. I will and bequeath to my son John Morgan in
trust for the sole and separate use of Nancy Ke Barnett during
her life and at her death to her body have one third of my
estate after carrying out Item third.

Item 6. It is my will and desire that my Executor in
hiring or disposing of my two negro's to be careful not to put
them in cruel or ~~unmerciful~~ unmerciful hands.

Item 7. I will and bequeath to my son John Morgan one
third of my estate after carrying out Item third.

Item 8. I hereby constitute and appoint my son John
Morgan Executor of this my last will and testament this the
13 day of August 1863
