1st I give one half my estate to the
superannuated Ministers, belonging to the
North Georgia Conference, Methodist Episco-
pal Church South, of the State aforesaid.
The amount to be divided among them
according to their necessities, as the Con-
ference may think best.

2nd I will the other half of my estate to
the Cause of domestic & foreign Missions,
to be equally divided between the two
missions of the Methodist Episcopal
Church South, and in conclusion I
appoint Wm J. Smith of the County of
Newton And J. H. M. Mullaw of the County
of Henry, both of the State aforesaid to be
my legal Executors, to apply my estate as
above set forth.

in the year of our Lord eight hundred and sixty
