 Testimony

Miss Hannah M. Wright

State of Georgia

I, the undersigned, being desirous of disposing of my worldly goods, and being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make, ordain, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament.

I am 1st I commend my soul to God who gave it in the hope of His gracious acceptance by Him, and my body to my family relations and friends, to be by them buried in a plain decent manner.

I am 2nd I wish all my past debts paid.

I am 3rd I give and bequeath my watch and chain to my niece, Miss M. A. Jones.

I am 4th I give and bequeath to my sisters, Mrs F. D. Webb, my gold bracelets and Spectacles.

I am 5th I give and bequeath all my clothing and household furniture to my two sisters Mrs M. A. Jones and Mrs F. D. Webb, share and share alike.

I am 6th I give and bequeath unto my brother-in-law Henry L. Brittain, the sum of three hundred dollars, to be expended in the erection of a monument or tombstone in the

burial, or if this should be done during my lifetime, this bequest is hereby revoked, and shall become inoperative and void.

I am 7th I give and bequeath the balance of my estate, real, personal and mixed to my sisters, Elizabeth R. Wright, and Elizabeth Wright, and my sisters, Mrs Mary C. Jones and Mrs of my sister, Elvira C. Jones and Julia C. Bond. I have to be equally divided between them, the children of my two last named sisters, now deceased, to receive respectively the share he would receive under this bequest, and should either of my brothers or sisters now living die before division under this bequest, then the children of the one dying, to receive three-fourths or mother's share, the division to be made by private or public sale at the discretion of my executor hereinafter appointed.

I am 8th I hereby nominate, constitute, and appoint my brother, Irvin Wright of Houston County and State aforesaid, executor to this my last will and testament.

In testimony whereof, I, the said Hannah M. Wright, have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 8th day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty two (1882).

I, Manah M. Wright of the
County and State aforesaid, being of
sound mind and disposing memory do
make order and declare thus to be a
Covenant to the foregoing, my last will
and testament

I have held for several years a
promissory note on my brother
C. C. Wright amounting up to the
date principal and interest is six
thousand eight hundred and eighty four
and 69/100 dollars which I have or
shall give up in consideration of
and in exchange for nine hundred and
seventy five acres of land in Clarke
County the deeds to which from the
said C. C. Wright to me will locate and
distinguish the two tracts comprising the
above number of acres. Now when the land
is sold as I contemplate doing in a
short time either publicly or privately
if it fails to sell for the said sum of
six thousand eight hundred and eighty
four & 69/100 dollars, then the deficit shall
be made up and accounted for out of
the probate share of said C. C. Wright in
my estate before a disinterested place

In addition to her probate share of my
estate I give and bequeath unto my
niece, Jane M. Wright, one share of
Georgia Route road stock

I nominate and appoint my brother
Franklin Wright, my executor in this
my codicil executed

I hereby revoke the bequest contained
 in the last will of my said will, and

 in the burial lot of my lot in the Town
 of Wright in Covington Ga. I direct
 that my executor do expend out of my
 estate the sum of three hundred dol-
 lars, or about that sum, in the erection
 of a monument or tombstone to mark

Having this day January 5, 1891,

 Wright (named as one of my legal ex-
 ecutors) the sum of Eight hundred dollars
 for his use in buying a home, I
 charge him with said sum of Eight
 hundred dollars, with interest from
 this date, in the distribution of my
 estate among my legal ex-
 ecutors
