 make and ordain this to be my last will
 and testament, hereby revoking all former
 wills.

Item 1st I commit my body to the grave in
 decent Christian burial, and my soul
 to God, who gave it, trusting in the merits
 of my Redeemer for Eternal Salvation after
 death.

Item 2nd I wish all my debts to be paid as
 soon after my death as convenient.

Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my sons,
 Robert Henderson, and John Henderson,
 and my daughter Mary Eliza, wife of
 B. F. Gray all my property of every kind
 and description, as well money and incomes
 of debt, as all other property, to be divided
 equally among my said three children,
 when and when able. The portion of
 my said daughter, I give for her sole
 and separate use.

Item 4th I hereby nominate and appoint my
 sons, Robert Henderson, and John Henderson
 executors to this my last
 will and testament. In witness of all
 which, I have hereunto set my hand and
 affixed my seal. This the 6th day of April-
 1871.
