said niece one half undivided interest in the
account of land in Newton County - near Co-
mington being the place bought of H. Coe
by Henry Rivers. The household goods con-
sist of one bed room suit with bedstead
dresser wash-stand, nice large cane bed etc

easy chairs one fine upright piano, China cabinet etc;
one hardware set consisting of one fine black movable eight
day clock one new look-stone with sink, silver
steel one swinging lamp one fine glass cabinet
