I Robert D. Livingston of said
State and County Being of sound
age but of Sound Mind and Consciousness
knowing that I must sometime depart
This I deem it right and proper both
as respects my family and myself that
I should make a disposition of the
property which I own or hold
Now I do therefore make
This my last will and Testament hereby
revoking and annulling all others by
me heretofore made

First I desire and direct that my Body be
buried in a decent and Christian like
Manner suitable to my circumstances and
condition in life

Second I desire that all my just debts be paid
without delay by my Executor hereinafter
named and appointed

Thirdly I give Bequeath and devise to my Beloved
wife Eliza P. Livingston for her Sole &
Separate use for and during her
Natural life the house and lot on
which I now reside together with all the
household and Kitchen Furniture I own
Bequeath to her my said wife all my
personal property of whatever kind
to use as she may think

proper that I may be free from of all my debts

Fourthly I further give Bequeath and devise to my said
wife a certain lot of land to her husband and
family (220) lying and being State and County land
of Johnston County and known as the McLaughlin
place for her sole and separate use during
her natural life

Fifthly I give Bequeath and devise to my Beloved
Daughter Mrs. A. M. Davis wife of Dr. A. M. Davis
one certain lot of land to her husband and
family (221) containing her husband and
wife's acres and known as the McLaughlin
place in the State and County above named
to said lot of land in any and belonging to
her own property and being and being
forever with full power and authority
same by deed or otherwise in the my
deem proper

Sixthly That of land to her husband and family
(222) known as the Livingston place herein
given and Bequeathed to my wife in joint
article of this will for and during her natural
life (after her estate therein is over) I give
Bequeath and devise to Dr. A. M. Davis as
 trustee for my Beloved Granddaughter Eliza
S. Shockey, however however that in the
event of the death of the said Eliza S.
Shockey without natural death heirs of
her Body then the said Eliza S. Shockey
said lot of land to 220 shall revert to
and pass in my Daughter Mrs. A. M. Davis

Seventhly All the property given to my wife in the
third article of this will (that she may
be free from of all her debts (after her
estate therein is over) I give Bequeath
and devise and give to my Daughter Mrs.
A. M. Davis and the said Eliza S. Shockey
A. M. Davis as trustee for my

Daughter Eliza & Family provided that in the event of the death of the said Eliza & Family the said Natural Issue then the portion of her share to her share next to and next in my Daughter Ann & H. Davis
