lish and declare the following as
my last will and testament

That after my death and on the marriage
or becoming of lawful age of
the youngest of my three children

Cyrus - or the youngest child then
living, it is my will and desire
that all my property both real
and personal - except the place
wherein I now reside known
as the Henderson place to sell
and the proceeds of said sale
be equally divided among my
children as above named then
surviving. And in case any one
or more of my said children shall
marry and the surviving children
such children shall receive the por-
tion in said division as the deceased
parent would be entitled to, if
living.

Until the happening of said
events as above stated which pro-
vides for the sale of my property
(except the Henderson place) said
property shall be kept together and
the rents issues and profits from the
same shall be used in the raising
and education of my children.

Should my mother Mrs. G. F.
Simpson, survive me I hereby
give and bequeath to her for
and during her life the Black

whereon I now reside with its timber acres
of land attached thereto known as the
Henderson place located in the town of
Constitution being South of the public square
and to her death or should I survive her
said property to be sold and divided a-
mong my children, the same as my other
property as provided in the first clause
of this my will.

I hereby appoint W. B. Simpson as my
executor to execute this my will.
