The same to be held and used by them for their mutual support and benefit until my Wife marries or my Daughter Lou Evans Glasp marries or arrives at the age of twenty-one years. Upon the happening of either of these events that is the marriage of my Wife the marriage of my daughter or her coming of age that the property embraced in this item of my will be equally divided between my Wife Mary N. Glasp and my daughter Lou Evans Glasp.

Item 3rd I hereby invest my Wife with power to sell and convey any of my property in as full and ample a manner as I could myself. This item means simply that she has power to change the character of the investment whenever she shall deem it best for herself and child.

Item 4th I hereby nominate and appoint my beloved Wife Mary N. Glasp Executor of this my last will and testament.
