Item I give unto my son William M. Shell Twenty dollars
unto him and his heirs forever and in case of my estate,

Item I give unto my daughter Sophia M. Shell one
hundred dollars unto her and her heirs forever

Item I give unto my grandson Henry M. Shell fifty
dollars unto him and his heirs forever

Item I give unto my grand daughter Martha Ann Hight fifty
dollars unto her and her heirs forever

Item I give unto my grandson John A. Shell fifty dollars unto
him and his heirs forever

Item I give unto my son John E. Shell one hundred dollars
unto him and his heirs forever

Item I give unto my son Henry J. Shell one hundred dollars
unto him and his heirs forever

My Will is that the land and furniture be sold after
thirty days notice at three public places in the County where
in I live in and to pay any expenses that may come or after my
decease and if there is any money after the expenses it is to be
divided between my six children by name her mentioned
Shall Martha Ann Hight and John E. Shell unto them and
theirs forever

This is my Will and desire that each one know their
part I have left to them and if then or either of them
refuse to have their part I have left them after sixty
days notice then it is my will that it be equal divided
between my grand children by name Henry M. Shell and
Martha Ann Hight and John E. Shell and lastly I do

affiant John Maddocks my deponent to this my to the
my last will and testament in testimony whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal this 30th of August
