6th I give and bequeath to Joseph Moberg one Dollar

7th I give and bequeath to my Executors or trust for my said
 daughters Elizabeth M., Rebekah & Sarah Jane my negro Ann and
 her increase to be by them managed to the best interest of my said
 children with the privilege to Amanda M. Lee from whom I
 bought her to redeem her within the next five years by paying
 for the increase of said negro of any according to value

 under A. W. Evans Executors of this my last will and testament.
