it my duty to make this my last will and

this my last will hereby renouncing all other
wills by me previously made.

In the first place I request that my just
debts be paid.

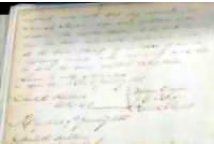
In the second place I give unto my beloved

on during her natural life or widowhood.
And at her death or marriage said tract of
land to be sold and the proceeds of the same
to be equally divided between my two children
born viz. William James and Rebecca
Jane. And I should say more. The balance
of my property both real and personal I
bequeath it to be sold to the highest bidder
at such a Convention after my decease
and the proceeds of the same to be equally
divided between my said wife or before
mentioned two children. In the third place
I appoint my brother William Stewart my
lawful Executor to this my last will and testa-
ment.
