Whites and Negroes be my executor to act  
as they think best for the widow and orphans so as to  
make a support for the widow and orphans and to  
educate the orphans and my will is further that my  
wife shall give to our children a sum of  
of age or more of so much of the property as the  
law allows and my wife shall see that they can have  
to give to all of the rest after raising our children  
whenever the rest of the orphans and a stipend  
for my wife during her lifetime, only that there  
shall be a yearly part of all that is given to the  
house agreeable to my will.
