this my last will and testament, in words
and form following.

For the love and affection I bear unto my
wife Sarah Lusk, I give and bequeath
unto the said Sarah my wife the following
negro Servants, Alley and Jerry, I also give
and bequeath unto Sarah my wife one Servant
Mary, one Eq. Wagon built and harness and furi-
ture belonging to the same, one Reaper, Wagon,
one tea table, one fold table, one cracking tool,
and working clothes, and his Revol Revolution arm.

For the love and affection I have for my son
William A. Lusk I give and bequeath unto
him the following negro slaves, viz Jack Wagon
and Erney, and two thousand and twenty five
dollars to be paid out of the money arising
from the sale of the property hereinafter to be
disposed of.

For the love and affection I have for my son
Samuel A. Lusk, I give and bequeath unto
him the following negro slaves (Wright Washington
and Sophia also one thousand and twenty
five dollars to be paid out of the money
arising from the sale of the property hereinafter
to be disposed of.

For the love and affection I have for my son
Abraham A. Lusk, I give and bequeath
unto him the following negro slaves viz Loe
Wright Tiller and Tabbotta, also one thou-
sand and twenty five dollars to be paid out
of the money arising from the sale of the
property hereinafter to be disposed of.

For the love and affection I have for my
daughter Mary Ann Lusk, I give and
bequeath unto her, Magdalen Lusk

the following man whom my late father
deceased John James and wife
for the use and support of my daughter
Julia C. Hubbard I give and bequeath her the
following money negro slaves and other things
situate in the County of Loudon and the State of Virginia
amounting five dollars to be paid out of the money
arising from the sale of the property hereinafter
described of. It is my will and desire
that all the property not herein conveyed away
be otherwise disposed of, be sold, and after
paying my debt and the legacies in money
bequeathed to my sons William C. Tucker, Samuel
C. Tucker and daughter
Julia C. Hubbard the money and other evidences
of debt arising from the sale thereof, be
equally divided between my wife Jane
Tucker, William C. Tucker, Samuel C. Tucker,
Abraham C. Tucker Mary Ann Tucker, and
Julia C. Hubbard.

I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint
my son William C. Tucker Abner C. Tucker
Abraham C. Tucker Executors of the my
last will and testament, hereby revoking
all former wills and testaments, at any time
heretofore by me made and do declare
this to be my last will and testament.
In witness whereof I have at the bottom of
the second sheet of this my will the whole
being included in two sheets, subscribed my
name and affixed my seal the sixteenth day
of December, in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and thirty five
A.D. dated, declared and published
in the presence of
