Item 1st I desire and direct that my body be buried

Item 2nd I desire that all my just debts be paid as
 soon after my death as possible there being
 but few of any.

Item 3rd That in consideration of my having been Compelled
 to expose or pay out a sum of money in
 liquidating Howard and other Cook's accounts
 now due John & Weaver on his account equal to
 the distribution should you Estate.

Jan 8th 1793 I was told by well cred. persons that I should
say of my children do before I die that we
that we are the children of a black woman and that
that it is better to be a black than to be a white
woman or mother.

Page 68. It is therefore apparent, I am assured, as
