Jacob N. Whipple of said State and
 County being of a advanced age but of
 sound and disposing mind and
 memory, knowing that I must shortly
 depart this life, deem it right and proper
 that I should make a disposition
 of the property with which a kind Pro-
 vidence has blessed me. I do therefore
 make this my last will and testament,
 hereby revoking and annulling all
 others by me heretofore made.

First - I desire and direct that my body
 be buried in a decent and Christianlike
 manner, suitable to my circumstances
 in life.

Secondly - I desire and direct that all my
 just debts be paid without delay
 by my Executor hereinafter named
 and appointed.

Thirdly - I give, bequeath and devise to
 my beloved niece Sarah E. Biggers
 the North half of lot of land three (3)
 hundred and sixty in the ninth
 District of Originally Henry now
 Newton County, containing one hun-
 dred and three acres more or less - also
 all that tract or parcel of land known
 as a part of lot number (316) of originally
 Henry now Newton County, it being the
 same purchased by me from H. P. Clark,
 and fully described in a deed from him
 to me, - with all the rights incidents and
 appurtenances to said lands in any wise
 belonging, free from all charge except
 as herein after imposed. To her own
 proper use benefit and behoof for

over with full power to dispose of the same by will or otherwise, as she may deem proper. I also bequeath to my beloved and dear daughter, all my personal property of whatever kind I may be possessed of.

And that

I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter, Mrs. James Crawford, the sum of one dollar, to have no good and lawful currency, which said amount I direct my executor to pay forth after my funeral expenses, and if there is not sufficient property, without the land being sold it is my desire that the same or enough thereof be sold, to pay said specific legacy.

And that

I hereby appoint my esteemed friend James Henry my Executor.

In witness whereof I, the said Jacob N. Whipple, to this my last will, have set my hand and seal, this 18th August 1874.
