

Item first I give and bequeath unto my son Lemmon M. Brown in trust for my two grand children William Thompson and Caroline Thompson (children of my deceased daughter Minny Thompson) the sum of five hundred dollars. And it is my will and desire that my said son Lemmon M. Brown cause to be placed a nice Georgia Marble head & footstone with proper inscription thereon at the head and foot of the grave of his sister Minny Thompson near the site of the same to be paid out of my estate by my executors, and it is my will that my son Lemmon M. Brown further represent for said grandchildren both and put out to interest the said sum of five hundred dollars until my said grand children shall become twentyone years of age, then my son Lemmon M. Brown shall pay over to her whensoever she comes in her own proper person the one half of said sum of money with interest of seven one half that my have accumulated thereon, & the other half to be kept as aforesaid until the said William Thompson shall become twentyone years of age then to be paid over to him whensoever he comes in his own proper person and demand the same but in the event of the death of either the said children Caroline or William the survivor of them shall in coming of age be entitled to the whole sum or coming forward in his or her own proper person and demanding the same, if both of them die or if neither of them apply for the said sum of money within two years next after my death then the said sum of money with the interest that may have accumulated thereon shall

be the same of five hundred dollars and the same shall be divided as the survivor

Item second I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Susan Brown during her natural life or so long as she shall live as a widow all my money both real and personal of whatsoever kind with all my money wherever of debts due to or subject however to the payment of the legacies herein after made.

Item third I give and bequeath to my son Stephen A. Brown in trust for the children a certain negro woman named Fanny Jones & her increase and also the sum of five hundred and twentyone dollars & twentyfive cents the amount I have heretofore let her husband Thomas Jones & I have the said negro woman Betty Wallace at my house & twentythree dollars & twentyfive cents making the sum of eleven hundred & twentythree dollars & twentyfive cents which said negro woman Betty & her increase & the said sum of money the said Stephen A. Brown is to hold in trust as aforesaid during the natural life of my said daughter Susan Jones & then said negro & their increase & the money to be equally divided amongst all of her children share and share alike

Item fourth I have heretofore given my son Lemmon M. Brown money & property to the amount of eleven hundred & twentythree dollars & twentyfive cents

Item fifth I give and bequeath to my son Dr. William Brown in trust for my two grand children Elizabeth Mary Thomas Mary & Charlotte Mary the children and he two children the sum of five hundred and twentyone dollars & twentyfive cents the sum I have heretofore given to my son Dr. William Brown in trust for all the said children until they respectively come of age or marry then each to receive no more than a part thereof

Item sixth I have heretofore given my son Lemmon M. Brown money & property to the amount of eleven hundred & twentythree dollars & twentyfive cents

Item seventh I have heretofore given my son Dr. William Brown money to the amount of eleven hundred & twentythree dollars & twentyfive cents

Item 8th I give and bequeath to my son Stephen A. Brown in trust for the children a certain negro woman named Fanny Jones & her increase and also the sum of five hundred and twentyone dollars & twentyfive cents the amount I have heretofore let her husband Thomas Jones & I have the said negro woman Betty Wallace at my house & twentythree dollars & twentyfive cents making the sum of eleven hundred & twentythree dollars & twentyfive cents which said negro woman Betty & her increase & the said sum of money the said Stephen A. Brown is to hold in trust as aforesaid during the natural life of my said daughter Susan Jones & then said negro & their increase & the money to be equally divided amongst all of her children share and share alike

Item ninth I have heretofore given to my son Stephen A. Brown money & property amounting to the sum of eleven hundred and twentythree dollars and twentyfive cents
