I, William D. Lusher Sr. of the County of Newton, and State of Georgia, being of sound & disposing mind and memory, do make and publish this my last will and testament, do make and all wills by me at any time heretofore made, hereby revoking and annulling, I commit my soul to God who gave it, and my body to Christian burial -

Item 1st I decree and direct that my Executors herewith named, namely as they may deem fit, do make sale publicly or privately, and by way of a certain lot of land belonging to me, and lying in Lumpkin County, Georgia, and pay all my just debts, arising from these two sources, they

Item 2nd I give & bequeath to my daughter Eliza, all my furniture, bed & bedding. My books to be divided among my children as they may see proper.

Item 3rd Having a policy of life insurance in the Georgia Mutual Life Insurance Company, it is my will that, legal representatives after my death, all sums advanced by any of my children, or sons in law, in payment of my mortgage due to said Insurance Company, be repaid with interest to the child or son in law making such advance. And I further will and direct that if any of my children or sons in law, shall be taxed with my support and maintenance in my old age, or shall make any advance of money to me, such child or son in law shall be fully reimbursed, on such account out of said insurance fund.

Item 4th The residue of my estate, I had intended to divide equally between my two youngest children, William, Alfred and Eliza, but at the special voluntary request of my beloved son Alfred, who desires his sister Eliza to have his share, I will bequeath one third of said residue to the said William, and the remaining two thirds to the said Eliza.

I hereby appoint my son William L. Luckie
 Executor and desire that my will shall be proved
 in the County of Jasper, and that when the probate of the
 said will shall be taken before the Court of the
 Ordinary of said County, as all other probates
 in this County shall be taken, my hand and
 seal this 21st day of October 1875.
