 thousand dollar cash, all my stock of horses,
 cattle and hogs, all the furniture in the room
 usually called the family room, consisting of
 one wardrobe, one washstand, two small
 side boards, one bed and bedstead, with
 all suitable furniture or clothing for the same,
 one sewing machine, one half of the
 kitchen furniture and fixtures, one half
 of the crockery, pantry and dining room
 fixtures, one wagon, rockaway, an buggy
 and harness with all the farming and
 garden tools, one silver pitcher & all
 and further, that she have the use and
 possession of my house and lot, and
 also of the lot of 6 1/2 acres of land, lying
 north of Oxford, one mile, for two years
 after my death, unless she should sooner
 leave to occupy the same.

I give to my grand children, heirs
 of my son O. B. Parks, deceased, viz. Sarah
 H. Carley, Eliza T. Wilson, William W. Parks,
 Mary E. Parks and, Elson H. Parks and
 their mother, viz. B. Parks, each twenty
 five dollars, and Nancy P. Crisler twenty
 five dollars.

To my son Harwell W. Parks, I give
 two hundred dollar.

To my daughter Elizabeth C. Thompson

I give one thousand dollars.

To Elizabeth Parks, wife of my son

Wesley J. Parks, and his five children, viz.
 Harry, William, Salus, Antoin, and Norah,
 I give each one hundred and ten
 dollars.

To Martha E. Daniels I give six hun-

dred dollars.

To Mary E. Harris I give six hundred.

To Ellen N. Harrison I give two hun-

dred dollars to be placed in the hands of
 her trustee, H. H. Parks for her use and the
 use of her children.

To my grand son William A. Pender-

grass and grand daughter Nancy J. Pittbanks
 I give one hundred and twenty five dollars
 each.

To my sister Mary Baker of Hall
 County I give fifty dollars.

To my nephew, Jerry Parks, I give
 fifty dollars.

To my girl daughter Salus C. Pugh
 I give fifty dollars.

To the Trustee of Emory College, one
 following conditions, I give five hundred
 dollars. Provided that said trustee

shall well and truly pay or cause to be
 paid, to my Executors, all the moneys
 that said College or Trustee is entitled
 to for for loaned money, within the
 space of two years, after my decease.

Said money to be applied to the building
 or making each repairs as may be needed
 by said College.

I wish that my books be divided into
 eight equal lots, as near as practicable by
 my Executors, & that my wife and each
 of my children have a lot.

I wish that my Executors reserve a
 sufficient amount of the funds belonging
 to my estate to fix up my grave in a
 decent but plain manner.
