I Hansford D Morley of the County of Newton and State of Georgia being of sound and disposing mind and memory and being desirous of settling my worldly affairs while I have strength to do so as shall and publish this my last will & Testament hereby revoking all others by me at any time heretofore made And first. I commit my soul to God who gave it and my body I desire to be buried beside the remains of my beloved Wife in the burying ground in the town of Gingers in said County and my worldly estate I dispose of as follows.

First. I desire and direct all my debts paid out of my estate and if I should die from home it is my wish that my remains be brought back and buried as above designated.

Second. The balance of my estate both real and personal I give and bequeath to my beloved Father Darwell Morley and my father-in-law Abijah Overton share and share alike.

Third. I appoint Abijah Overton my Executor to carry into effect this my last will and Testament, whom I direct to sell all my estate, except evidences of debt, and after all is converted into money to make the distribution as directed in the second clause of this my last will and Testament. My grave I desire and direct my Executor to have it done enclosed in like manner to that around the remains of my Wife.

In witness whereof I the said Hansford D Morley to this my will consisting of the foregoing sheet of paper have set my hand and seal this 30th September 1861
