

Newton County To the name of Geo. Lewis Johnson of the County and State aforesaid being of sound and sobering mind and memory but on public health and on account of the imminent situation of life - so made and gave this to be my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills

Item first I wish all my past debts paid so soon as they can conveniently be out of the first money collected belonging to my estate

Item second I give and bequeath unto my only daughter Mary Frances Faxon Johnson the sum of twenty dollars in addition to what she has already received

Item third I give and bequeath unto my son William J. Wright in trust and for the use and benefit of my son Leonard J. Wright the sum of Two hundred dollars with the privilege to the said trustee to advance to the said Leonard J. Wright the whole or any part of said sum as he may deem proper for his greater comfort

Item fourth I give and bequeath unto my daughter Frances Ann Rebecca Galloway and her children free from the disposition of her parents or any father husband or negro boy named Knott about eighteen years old and a negro girl named Celestia about eleven years old with the understanding that if my son William J. Wright or his heir he is to have the said boy Knott at his appraised value, and the money to be laid out by my daughter in purchasing another negro which said daughter agrees to take the place of the said boy Knott

It is further my Will that the property given in this item is out on the faith of issue of the said Frances Ann Rebecca Galloway to my son William J. Wright

Item fifth I give and bequeath all the remainder and residue of my property both real and personal of all kinds to my son William J. Wright

Item sixth I hereby constitute and appoint my son William J. Wright sole executor of this my last Will and Testament
