 In the name of God Amen
 I, William Millingham of San
 Jose and County being of advanced age and of
 sound mind and memory, knowing the value
 and worth of my family and myself, that I should make
 a disposition of my property and estate, do hereby
 declare that I do hereby make this my
 last Will and Testament, hereby appointing and
 naming as my executor by and hereof made.

First - I desire and direct that my body be buried in
 a decent and Christianlike manner suitable
 to my Christian and Christian in life.
 My last will and testament shall return to God, as he gave
 it, and I hope for eternal life through the merits
 of Christ.

Secondly - I desire and direct that all my just debts be
 paid by my executor herein after named and
 appointed.

Thirdly - I give bequeath and devise to my beloved wife
 Mary One hundred acres of land more or less
 to be an abode for my widow's situation. Also
 One hundred acres of land being part of lot
 No 16 and 17 with all the rights, meadows and
 appurtenances to said land in any civil belonging
 to her or all benefit and behoof during
 her life. I also give and bequeath unto
 my wife in the same manner the farming utensils
 used on and belonging to the farm. Also my
 stock of all kinds. Also my house and
 kitchen furniture and any and all other
 personal property of which I may be possessed
 at death not herein mentioned, all of said property
 both real and personal to be held during
 natural life for her use and that of my
 beloved daughter, Dollie Appellia during her
 single life.

Fourthly - I give bequeath and devise to my son William
 all the property of which I am now possessed

in clause third (as given to my wife during her life) at
 the death of my beloved wife. I do hereby make this
 and bequeath to my wife for her life and benefit
 and I do hereby make this my last will and testament
 provided all that I have during her life and
 my daughter Dollie Appellia during her single life
 of my daughter Dollie Appellia and provided also that
 my wife shall have the privilege of giving to her
 such personal property as she may deem best and
 providing also that my son pay all my just debts.

Fifth - I do direct that my son pay all my just debts
 to pay my just debts I do direct that the same
 hundred acres mentioned in clause third as part
 of lot No 16 and 17 be sold at such private or
 public sale and the proceeds as much thereof as
 may be needed be appropriated to the payment of
 my just debts by my executor as herein after
 named and in the event my executor is unable
 to sell said land to pay my debts then my son
 William shall pay my debts then of my son
 William during her single life and at the
 death of my wife Mary all the property both
 real and personal shall be to my son William
 for his own use and benefit forever.

Sixth - I hereby constitute and appoint my son William
 executor of this my last Will and Testament
 This June 22nd 1881
