to me by the name of Emeline during her natural life in
dependant of all and every other person or persons what
ever and after her decease for the said negro girl basco and
her increase to go the issue of her body if any
I have and to hold the said negro girl & her increase in depen-
dantly of all and every other person or persons whatever
until her decease and if the said basco should leave
her issue of her body then for the said girl Emeline & her
increase to return to my Estate, I also give my said daughter
a good feather bed and furniture
In testimony I the said Benjamin Sansing have
signed set my hand and seal this Eleventh (11) day of
September A.D. 1845 & since the declaration of the
Independence of the United States of America the
sixth Nineteenth
