

Nicholas Dixon Will

I, Nicholas Dixon a bachelor of the County of Shelby
 do hereby certify that being a sound mind and memory but desiring that it be separated from
 me I have come to die do hereby and I make this to be my last Will and
 Testament without revoking all other Wills or Testaments heretofore made
 by me. 1st Item I do hereby wish and desire that after my Death my
 body should be buried in a decent Christianlike Burial & my soul
 be commended to him who giveth life to the World by Jesus Christ.
 2nd Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Martha the
 sum of Five or six hundred dollars for use of the property both real &
 personal of any kind and description that I shall by her at the
 time of our last intermarriage in March last consisting of Land
 in Jones County Georgia and elsewhere and further I give
 unto her with my said beloved Wife Martha during her life
 or widowhood all that part of the land on which I now live
 being situated at Lyons Corner near my former home nearly or next
 to a Spring near the School House then down the stream to
 William Jones and his line including nearly half of the land whereon I
 now live North of said line and the line between my Dwelling there
 and other Out Houses and also I give unto my said beloved Wife
 Martha or Widowhood my Negro boy named Daniel about 15 years
 old but it is my Request Will and desire that from the property
 I have given my beloved Wife Martha that she do not take the
 said land the term of our intermarriage shall be paid, and said land
 not to be paid from the part of my Estate. Item 3. all of the balance
 of the tract of Land on which I now live after taking off that part
 I have given to my beloved Wife Martha during her life or widowhood
 I now and bequeath to be equally divided & lots as they may think proper
 but I also give unto my said child some Redman Thomas Daniel whom my
 beloved Wife Martha should bring on said land all of the balance of the
 tract of Land the whole hereunto to be divided by them or lots as they may
 think proper. Item 4. I give and bequeath unto my son Nathan five dollars
 to be paid by my Executors. Item 5. I give and bequeath unto my daughter
 Mary McCall the sum of One Hundred dollars to be paid by my Executors.
 Item 6. I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah McKoy the
 sum of Five Dollars to be paid by my Executors. Item 7. I give and
 bequeath unto my Daughter Susan Brown five Dollars to be paid by my
 Executors. Item 8. I give and bequeath unto the legal heirs or representatives
 of my deceased Wife Martha the sum of One Hundred dollars to be paid by my
 Executors.

 I have also bequeathed to my daughter Sarah a lot of land which I may think fit
 to take into my land that I have mentioned. These several tracts of
 land I give to the Church of Christ on said farm all of the balance of the

 Church proper. I give and bequeath unto my son William for him
 to be paid by my Executors. Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter
 Sarah Miller the sum of One Hundred to be paid by my Executors.
 Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah for her
 sum of Five Dollars to be paid by my Executors. Item I give and
 bequeath unto my daughter Sarah for Dollars to be paid by my
 Executors. Item I give and bequeath unto the legal heirs or representatives
 of my deceased daughter Elizabeth Powell the sum of One Dollar
 to be paid by my Executors. Item I give all the balance of my estate of
 any kind or description it is my will and desire that it be paid by my
 Executors in such way they may see most to advantage and after paying
 all of my Just Debts I wish such as was owing by my right

After our Marriage I give bequeath to my free born (namely John, Daniel,
 Abraham, James, & Thomas) to be Equally divided between them as soon
 as such sale and account can take place. I am to be bound by my own
 Deed and will and I hereby declare to be my Executors of this my last will
 and I do hereby Constitute and appoint them the said
 John, Daniel, Abraham, James, & Thomas to be my Executors as aforesaid
