

George Peck's Last Will

I A B Peck of said State and county, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others that I have heretofore made

- Item 1 It is my will and desire that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner, suitable to my condition and circumstances in life. The place to be selected by my beloved wife.
- Item 2 It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid as soon as practical after my death by my executor herein after named and appointed.
- Item 3 I give and bequeath all of my property both real and personal of whatever kind and wherever situated to my beloved wife Emma Eugie Peck for use and benefit in and during her natural life, or until she shall marry again.
- Item 4 At the death of my said wife, or at the time she should marry again, if she should so far forget my memory and wish as to so revolt to my beloved children, viz: Lucy, Joseph, Mary, Geo Peck, Willie, Margarette Brooks, Charley, Alfred Peck, and Eleanor Louise Peck, I should it be impossible for them to divide the property equally among them, then it is my will that the same be sold, and the proceeds divided equally, share and share alike among my said children.
- Item (5) If any of my said children should be dead when this my last will and testament takes effect, it is my will and desire that the child or children of such deceased child inherit in lieu of its deceased parent.
- If any of my said children should die before this my last will takes effect leaving no issue, it is my will and desire that a reasonable amount be spent from his or her share of this
