I David A. Williams of said State being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make this my last will and testament wishing easy and all such I may have hereafter make.

I Item I desire that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and condition in life.

I Item I desire and desire that all my debts be paid including expenses of last illness and funeral and all other expenses naturally incident as soon as practicable after my death.

I Item I I will and desire that my real estate be sold and the proceeds of said sale be divided equally among my six children Sarah Williams, John D. Williams, Fannie Williams, Mary Davis Williams, Emily Mae Williams, Mary Jane Williams, John and William Foster Williams there and there alike. Now as all my children except Fannie have been paid their shares (about \$1000) dollars it is my desire that she be paid three hundred (\$300) dollars to have her share out of the proceeds of my estate before there is any division. Then the remainder be equally divided there and there alike as above directed. Fannie Johnson's part are for her or her legally heirs only.

I Item I I will and bequeath to my daughter Fannie Johnson and her legally heirs my Piano, Linen, and the rest of my household and kitchen furniture I leave to all my children to be divided among them as they will divide each of them, but where all things let this division be made peaceably and in order.

I Item V I hereby appoint and constitute as my executors John D. Williams and Master Williams they to give bond and make returns to the Court in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this January 26th 1929.
