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# PAULDEN COUNTY



THIS LAND was surveyed and subdivided into 40-acre lots in 1833, and consists of the 2nd and 3rd and portions of the 1st, 18th and 19th districts, third section, and portions of the 18th and 19th districts, second section, of the Cherokee Purchase, embracing a part of what is known as the "Gold Belt," gold being found in all parts of the county.

Well timbered with many kinds of wood; well watered by thousands of sparkling springs and rivulets of purest freestone water; with mineral resources undeveloped; of an open and productive soil, adapted especially to the culture of the vine and fruits, cotton and corn; with mountainous hills and valleys furnishing scenery most enchanting, no country can boast of better health, of better advantage, nor of brighter prospect for pleasant and profitable life.
