

THREE OFFICERS IN U. S. CASUALTY LIST OF 36

Three Alabama Men Among the Southerners Wound- ed in France

WASHINGTON, June 3.—The army casualty list today contained thirty-six names, divided as follows:

Killed in action, four; died of wounds, three; died of accident, two; died of disease, seven; wounded in action, three; wounded severely, sixteen, wounded slightly, one.

Officers named were Lieutenant Harry F. W. Johnson, Bethlehem, Pa., killed in action; Lieutenant George W. McCabe, Vicksburg, Miss., wounded, degree not known; Lieutenant William Hepburn, Windsor, Conn., severely wounded.

Corporal Charlie T. Morrow, Douglas, Ala., and Private Oscar J. Carter, Arton, Ala., were among the severely wounded.

Two Georgians Dead

The army casualty list Sunday contained 85 names, divided as follows:

Killed in action, 16; died of wounds, 11; died of accident, 3; died of disease, 4; wounded, degree undetermined, 13; wounded severely, 29; wounded slightly, 5; missing in action, 4.

Two officers were named. Captain Charles J. Biddle, of Philadelphia, was wounded, degree undetermined, and Lieutenant Elmer D. Mackey, of McKeesport, Pa., is missing in action.

Severely wounded: William Stinson, No. 615 South Twelfth street, Nashville.

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
