the Sixth day of September Instant, he this Deponent was at the House of Major Tier, in Said County, that in the afternoon of that day, Seven Indians came to the House, Six of Them were Armed with guns & One with a bow and Arrows, That three of them were painted Red & Black, That the Indians robbed the House of said Tire, and also robbed from this deponant a Rifle gun, two Shirts, three pair of pantaloons, One great coat One close bodied Coat, three Vests One Axe, One Mat, One pocket Handkerchief, One and a half Bars of Lead, Some powder and powder-horn and One butcher Knife, All of which Articles, this deponent avers to be Worth, fifty four Dollars and fifty Cents, - This deponent further Swears, that he was present and did see them take several things Our of the House of said Tier - and that from the gestures of the Indians he the deponent was fearful, they would Take his Life - that whilst they were robing the House this deponent Made his Escape with two of the said Tire's Children, That this deponent has frequently seen Indians, and is acquainted with some words, of the Creek Indians, and Knows that they were of that Nation of Indians,
