

Extract of a letter from Major W^m M^cIntosh to his Father, General M^cIntosh, dated Frederica 18th March 1793.

-----"excuse this Scrawl, I write in great haste on acco^t of a
 "meeting now of the Island people for the purpose of falling on some
 "plan to relieve the distrefsd situation of the poor people on the
 "main, who are plundered of all their stock, some negroes &c^a - M^r Carhams
 "store on Satilla plundered & the two Clerks killed, they have also murdered
 "& plundered on S^t Marys --God knows how this unfortunate affair will
 "terminate -- I have all my huts at Pikes bluff filled with poor distrefsd
 "women & Children, I am in hopes we will be able to send over a small
 "party to day, tho' the Island people are very backward in going--I am
 "truly unhappy on acco^t of the situation of old Colonel M^cIntosh--There
 "was seen in one Party above 1½ miles from S^t Savilla Bluff or W^ms^burgh
 "23 Indians--This Luck is oppty of Tom Spalding's Boy which I first
 "heard of is waiting, will write fully by next oppty--I am &c^a
