





I was living two miles west of Newport when I first remember.

I have been living in Monroe County shout ten years. I know I have been living in Monroe County about ten years. I knew my grand mother Bony Lambert. She died just before I moved away. She was a very old woman. I have heard my mother say that she had Indian blood and that she was half-Cherokee. My grandmother was a whole Indian. I never heard my mother or my grandmother say that they got any money as Indians. I think I would have heard it if they had received it. I never heard of my mother or my grandmother living among the Indians. Martha Sexton lived in South Carolina the last I heard of her. My mother was in Cocke County close to Bybos P. O.
