

Gen. Hancock's Death.

WASHINGTON, February 11 — Profound regret is felt in all circles over the death of Major General Hancock. He was a model soldier and a dignified, courtly gentleman, whose loss will be severely felt. The War department and other buildings are being draped. Arrangements have been made for a full military representation at the funeral. Hancock was at the head of the list of Major Generals, standing next in rank below Lieut. Gen. Sheridan. His death leaves Gen. Schofield at the head of that grade. The retirement of Gen. Pope, next month, by reason of age, will leave another vacancy in the Major Generals. Gen. Howard is first, and Gen. Terry second on the list of Brigadiers, and are in the direct line for promotion.
