

SUICIDE IN MACON.

MUR. R. J. FITZGERALD SHOT DEAD.
WILL THROUGH THIS HERALD.

The Best Stenographer in the State Dead—
Deadly Glasses His Career—No Cause
Assigned for the Desperate
Deed—He Buried in Atlanta.

MACON, Ga., February 27.—Mr. R. J. Fitzgerald, the official stenographer of the Macon circuit, and well known throughout Georgia as the most expert short-hand writer in the profession, committed suicide. He arose from his bed and before dressing, walked to the mantel, procured a pistol, and deliberately shot himself behind the right ear, the ball coming out through the crown of the head. He died in a short time. He leaves a wife and two children. No cause can be assigned for the rash and desperate act. His remains will be sent to Atlanta for interment. Much sorrow is expressed by the entire community, as he was liked by all.
