The following are the laws laid down by the U. S. Government for the protection of newspapers: Selser who do not give express notice to the contrary are considered as wishing to con-tinue their subscripting.

are considered as wishing to con-tinue their subscription.

If subscribers order the discon-tirunnee of their periodicals, the publisher may continue to send them until arreanges are paid.

If subscribers move to other places without informing the publishers, and papers are sent to the former direction, they are held resonabile. held responsible.

The courts have decided that The courts have decided that refusing to take periodicals from offices before removing and leaving them uncalled for is prima facia evidence of intentional fraud. If subscribers pay in advance they are bound to give notice to the publisher at the end of their

they are bound to give notice to the publisher at the end of their time, if they do not wish to con-tinue taking it; otherwise the publisher is authorized to send it on and subscriber will be respon-sible until an express notice with payment of all arrears is sent to the publisher. Publishers of newspupers, can under law arreas a may for found

under law, arrest a man for fraud under law, arrest a man for fraud who takes a newspaper and re-fuses to pay for it. Under this law it is a dangerous trick for a man to allow his subscription ac-count to run on from six months to a year and then tell the post-mater to mark it "refused" or to send the editor a notice to discon-ing the marks. inue the paper.
