Inquisitive people will wonder how railroad conductors can save one hundred dollars a month out of a salary of seventy-five dollars. The same class of people wonder how a State official can save five thousand dollars a year out of a salary of two thousand. Its nobody's business, so long as the tax-payers don't object.

Newspaper Laws.

We would like the special attention of our postmasters and subscribers of this paper to the following synopsis of the newspaper laws:

1. A postmaster is required to give notice by letter (returning a paper does not answer the law) when a subscriber does not take his paper out of the office, and state the reasons for not being taken; any neglect to do so makes the postmaster responsible to the publisher for the payment.

2. Any person who takes a paper from the post-office, whether directed to his name or another, or whether he has subscribed or not, is responsible for the pay.

3. If any person has ordered his paper discontinued, he must pay all arrears or the publisher may continue to send it until payment is made and collect the whole amount, whether it be taken from the office or not. There can be no legal discontinuance until the payment is made.

4. If the subscriber orders his paper stopped at a certain time, and the publisher continues to send it, the subscriber is bound to pay for it, if he takes it out of the postoffice. The law proceeds upon the ground that a man must pay for what he uses.

5. The courts have decided that refusing to take a newspaper or periodical from the postoffice, or removing and having them uncanceled for, is prima facie evidence of intentional fraud.
