### Agricultural.

There are two ways in which a farmer are two definite rules without regard we definite rules without regard ways and the stances, or he may be defined his own judgement and regulate his own operation according to conditions. There is a tendency samong a large class of farmers to be guided by maxims which they have recipred from their fathers. They plant their corn and wheat as nearly as possible on stated days, or at stated times of the moon. They hoe and cultivate their corn a given number of times without much regard to the condition of the soil, and in all the routine of farm work, they keep as nearly as possible in the old track, believing that to be the only safe one.

When we consider the variety of circumstances under which the same crops are raised in different localities, it is evident that no rules can be given for their management that it will be best to follow in all cases. There are fields of corn that will thrive and produce well with very little culture, while others will be nearly ruined by guack grass and thistles without very thorough cultivation Sometimes the weeds are of such a bind that a smoothing harrow is the condition of the condition of the corn, he will not always age if at the least cost per bushel.
