Mrs. Wally Simpson Loses Guards But Is Given French Operatives

CANNES, France, Dec. 14. — (UP)—Mrs. Wallis Simpson lost her two Scotland Yard bodyguards today but got five French Surete General Operatives instead.

It was learned that British authorities called the Scotland Yard men home, declining to take further responsibility for Mrs. Simpson's safety.

A deluge of threatening letters has continued during her stay here, awaiting a final divorce decree so that she can marry the Duke of Windsor—Edward VIII.

As soon as she learned that the Scotland Yard men were going home she appealed to the French government for protection and the five detectives arrived today to take over.

Mrs. Buchanan Merriman, of Washington, D. C., Mrs. Simpson's aunt, who acted as her chaperon during her last weeks in London,

is expected here this week. Mrs. Simpson's servants arrived from London today.

It was believed that Mrs. Simpson might take over the villa at which she is staying, and that her hosts, Mr. and Mrs. Herman L. Rogers of New York, would return home for a visit.

Despite rumors, Mrs. Simpson seemed settled here at least for the duration of the Christmas holidays. Nevertheless a report which started at Vienna was current here today—that Mrs. Simpson had been invited to spend an indefinite time as the guest of Princeleleana of Roumania, wife of Archduke Anton of Austria-Hungary, at her castle about 30 miles from Innsbruck, Austria, where Edward is a guest.

The report here was that Mrs. Simpson might go to Austria for New Year's Day.
