THE NEXT STATE FAIR

From the Macon Telegraph:

The fair committee of the Georgia State Agricultural Society, at its recent meeting in this city, made some important changes in the premium list. As will be seen by the following memoranda, some of the premiums are handsome ones and will be worth contending for.

The county displays at the next fair, under the new arrangements, will be large and instructive. The committee continued the three premiums for county displays—\$1,000 for best display, \$500 for second best and \$250 for third best.

The committee has made quite an improvement in the manner of receiving a satisfactory award under the following scale of points as to merit.

Recognizing 100 points as perfect, agriculture will be rated at 10, garden vegetables 15, home industry 15, fruit 10, manufacture 5, work of art 10, woods & minerals 5.

It has been further arranged that county displays may be made up of individual displays that will be rated in awards by the same schedule of points as are fixed for county displays. For the best individual display the committee have offered \$500, for second best individual display \$250, for the third best display \$150, and for the fourth best display \$100.

Special inducements have been offered in unusually large premiums for Georgia bred horses, mules and cattle. Much the largest part of the prizes offered for livestock will be given to Georgia bred horses.

The premiums for home industry have been much advanced. For the best display of jellies, preserves, etc., the committee have offered \$50, for the second best display \$20. For the best and largest display in merit and variety of female handicrafts, \$50; for second best display \$25.

The committee reached out into a new field in offering a handsome premium to the mechanic making the largest and best display of his workmanship. The American Agriculturist, published at 793 Broadway, New York, offers \$500 for the largest yield of corn on one acre of land. This premium will open any state in the United States.

The conditions for entering, including ten cents for a copy of instructions to American Agriculturist, 793 Broadway, New York. The fair will open October 2nd and continue nine days. The premium list is now in the hands of the printer and it will soon be ready for distribution. Parties desiring copies can address R. A. Wilson, secretary, Macon, Georgia.

AN ALLIANCE CALL.

Mr. L. F. Livingston, President of the Farmers' State Alliance, has called for a meeting of delegates from the different county alliances to meet in Atlanta, April 10, to consider plans looking to the supply of seed, hogging, rice and fertilizers for the next season. It was said that Mr. Livingston says:

"If any arrangements are to be made by which we are to skip the unwarrantable and wicked imposition on the cotton producers of the last season, it must be attended to before the next annual meeting in August. As timely action may prove the means of saving next year of money and much confusion to cotton planters of the South, I must earnestly beg of the Presidents of each County Alliance to have the cotton belt to hold similar consultations and send accredited delegates to the meeting in Atlanta on the 10th of April next, that whatever may be done shall have the hearty co-operation of all Alliance men. Interested in the questions to be considered. Let our best men from every county assemble and adopt some plan by which the outrage perpetrated upon us by the bagging trust and the Government tax on ties shall be remedied."
