INCREASED CONSUMPTION OF OPIUM.—The increase in the use of opium in this country suggests that consumers will soon have a new money problem. The importation of opium from the Orient in 1920 was 631,000 pounds, an increase of ten times more than three years ago, and it is likely opium will continue to be imported in such quantities with stimulants that are used for medicinal purposes. In other words, more than 100,000 pounds of this drug will be used in stimulating purposes in this country.
