Wit Cattle and sheep and the balance
of the price said Lot of Land to
be Equally divided between my
Daughters Emily Parish Simpson
Lewis Mary Thomas Nancy
Annanda Grace and Sarah
Being the second I give
and bequeath unto my son
Lawrence Brantley \$25.00 in
in the Stock I own to 3 I give unto
my son Benjamin Brantley the balance
of my Stock after the aforesaid and
the said also I give unto my
Francis my sewing machine and
a Singer Machine I own
herby constitute my son Ben
Brantley Executor of this my
Will and Testament this 2nd day of
June 1877
