

Record of the Will of John Robbott Dec 22nd 1872

I John Robbott of said State and
County being in declining health and feeling that
I must shortly depart this life, understanding
it right and proper both in regard to my family
and myself that I should make a disposition
of the property which a kind providence has
blessed me with,

I hereby devise and direct
that my body be buried in a decent and suitable
like manner suitable to my rank and station and
condition in life My will is that my body be
rest with God who gave it,

Item I do devise and direct that all my
just debts shall be paid without delay by my
Executors hereinafter named my of which

Item Third I devise and direct that all my
property at my death after paying all
my just debts be equally divided between
my wife Caroline and my son Thomas
Robbott, Item fourth I devise and direct
that the one half of my estate hereby given
to my wife Caroline to have and to hold
to her as a life estate for her to live
on for and during her natural life
and at her death I devise and direct that
all of my estate devolved to and become
the sole property of my son Thomas Robbott

Item fifth I hereby constitute and appoint
my friend J. Robbott Executor to this my
will and Testament this 22nd day of
December 1872
