cows, hogs, farming tools and implements, wagons
house hold and kitchen furniture, money and
accounts, corn and fodder, provisions and
any and all the property that I may be possessed
of at my death and that may be left after the pay-
-ments of my debts and expenses mentioned in
Item 1st - to have and to hold the same to them or
said wife and children above named share and
share alike in fee simple for their own proper
use benefit and behoof.

Item 3rd - I hereby constitute and appoint my
Brother John T. Bailey executor of this my last
will and testament to act without being obliged
to give bond or to make returns to the Court of
Ordinary or any other Court - other than to have
this my last will and testament properly recorded
in the County Clerk's office.
