I, Louisa Allen of the County of Baker & State of Georgia being of sound and disposing mind & memory and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs while I have strength so to do Do make this my and publish this my last will & Testament - hereby revoking all wills heretofore made by me at any time And first I commit my soul to God who gave it and my body I desire to be buried by the side of my husband at Bethel Church in Baker County, and my worldly Estate I dispose of as follows

First After the payment of all Just debts & funeral expenses I desire my son Robt B Allen be allowed by the Executor to select such Beds & Bed clothes as he may desire.

Secondly I desire that all my effects both real & personal be sold for cash as soon after my death as practicable and the money arising from the sale to be used by the Guardian of son Robt B Allen to be expended in giving him a good practicable Education or as much thereof as is necessary for that purpose

Thirdly I appoint & request that Reuben Jones be my Executor to carry into effect the foregoing

Fourthly I further request that my son Robt B Allen choose Reuben Jones of said County as his Guardian In witness whereof I have the said Louisa Allen to this my will consisting of the foregoing two sheets of paper have set my hand and seal this 25th day of September 1875 Louisa Allen
