Baker County } Know all men by these presents that I
Reuben Jones of the State and County aforesaid
being of sound mind and memory and mindful
of the propriety of giving directions while yet in
health of mind and body, for the disposition
after my death of the worldly goods with which
God in his bounty has blessed me, do make,
publish and disclose this my last will and
testament -

Item 1st. Having bought of my brother, Otis Jones late of
Coweta County, Ga. deceased, during his life, his
prospective, or undivided interest in the estate of
my Father John Jones late of Fulton County
deceased, the deed of which I hold and is of
record in the clerk's office of Superior Court of
Fulton Co. Book F. F. Folio 373. It is my will
that my Nephew Robert O. Jones only child of
my brother Otis Jones shall inherit said interest
or share, (a part of which I have heretofore turned
over to my brother E. C. Jones of Fulton Co. trustee
and I hereby nominate and appoint said
E. C. Jones as trustee for said Robt O. Jones,
who shall receive the proceeds of said share (being
one eighth) of the executors of my Father's estate,
receipt them for the same and pay the same to
said Robt O. Jones when he becomes twenty one
(21) years of age - Provided that in the death of
said Robt O. Jones without leaving a child or child
then the whole of the said proceeds of said share
shall revert to my brothers and sisters and any
children heirs of said John Jones of Fulton Co.
Ga. deceased

Item 2nd. I will and bequeath to my wife Louisa A. Jones
for the term of her natural life, for her exclusive
use & benefit, the plantation on which I now live
containing 2.156 acres, more or less, provisions, tools
together with stock of all kinds, implements, houses
and kitchen furniture with all the rights and things
thereunto belonging, also the sum of One Thousand Dollars
(1,000⁰⁰ dollars) in cash to be paid to her by my executors
hereinafter named -

Item 3rd. It is my will that as soon after my death as
may be practically convenient, shall be

to collect all notes, mortgages, liens, accounts, and other evidences of debt, that are in my possession at the time of death out of which they shall first pay all of my debts, second pay to my wife the one thousand dollars provided for in item 2nd and the balance to be divided equally between my two daughters to wit. Cora V wife of J. A. Williams of Bibb County and Ella E. wife of W. A. Newson of Lee County -

Item 4th Whereas the estate of my brother P. W. Jones is not yet fully administered and there is yet due me the proceeds of the same the sum of two thousand (2000⁰⁰) dollars, more or less, I will and bequeath all money coming to me from said estate, together with my undivided interest in the plantation and stock of said P. W. Jones to my two daughters named in item 3rd.

Item 5th Whereas the estate of my Father, John Jones late of Fulton Co. Ga. is not yet fully administered nor can it be until after the death of my mother I will and bequeath all moneys coming to me, as an heir of said estate, to my two daughters named in item 3rd except the sum of one thousand (1000⁰⁰) dollars which shall be paid to the four (4) children of my deceased son F. C. Jones of Dougherty Co. who are herein after named -

Item 6th After the death of my wife I will and bequeath to my four grandchildren - Orie, Primus Walter, Franklin Chandler and Ivis Beale children of my deceased son F. C. Jones all the property described and willed to my wife in Item 2nd of this instrument the title in them to be absolute, and fee simple, except the household and kitchen furniture which I will to my two daughters named in Item 3rd of this instrument.

Item 7th I nominate and appoint my two sons in law - J. A. Williams of Bibb Co. and W. A. Newson of Lee Co. my executors and they shall not be required to give bond. In witness whereof I have on this day of Decr 1891 in the town of Newton, Baker Co. Ga. hereunto set my hand and seal. Reuben Jones (35)
