however the same is to be kept and ~~expended~~  
for the use benefit and education of  
my said children and wife in such manner  
to my said wife whom I hereafter  
nominate as my sole executrix as may seem  
most advantageous for the welfare of her  
self and said children. And is not  
to be divided at the instance of either  
of my said children unless they  
shall appear to my said wife  
as proper and right. Leaving the  
entire management of my estate  
in her hands to be kept together as  
well as to her may seem to the  
best interest of her self and children

Item 3rd I hereby nominate, constitute and  
appoint my wife Jean Livingston  
the sole executrix of this my last  
will and Testament and I Expressly  
confer upon her power as such to  
Administer my estate, excusing her  
from giving any bond, or making  
any return to the Ordinary. And  
I expressly confer upon her the full  
power and Authority to sell all or  
any part of my estate at public  
or private sale with or without

notice as she may deem best. And with out any order of Court making good and sufficient conveyances to the purchaser or purchasers. I further expressly confer upon her the power and authority to borrow money for the use of said estate in any instance where she may think it necessary and proper and to secure the same by lien, mortgage, security deed or trust deed, or other form of security to or upon all or any part of my estate and this she may do without any order of Court.
