 and to divide the proceeds of said sale equally among
 my children, to wit: Amy Eliza, Sophia, Maria, Andrew

amies.

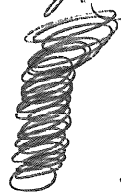
4th Item. I desire that my Executors hereinafter named in the will, that my beloved wife shall desire to leave the place wherein she now lives, consisting of all my landed estate, shall sell the same, and apply a portion of the proceeds of said sale, to the purchase of another place, such as she may desire, and will be suitable to her condition in life, and if there should be a surplus after said purchase, arising from the sale of my lands with their appurtenances, the same. I wish my Executors to put out at interest, and apply the interest accruing thereon, in such manner as they may deem proper, in the education of my children aforesaid.

5th Item. I desire and direct that my Executors, at the marriage of any of my children, shall select from my personal property, such articles or things as may be necessary for them to commence house keeping and that no more be given to one than another.

6th Item. I hereby constitute and appoint R. P. Sackey and John Kennedy, my Executors of this my last will and testament. This August the 4th 1853.
