life time or widowhood, after which I give and bequeath
the same to my Children. Further I advise that my Sons
with the exception ^{of the last} I now live on which are six in number
Situated as follows Number two hundred and sixteen
(216) Seventh district and three sections. No. nineteen & 20
Nineteenth district and first section. To three hundred and
and the same to be divided equally among them.

The other three gold lots No eleven thirteenth and a fifty two
(112) fifth district and a first section. No one thousand and
seventy nine (1079) Seventeenth district and third section. No
one thousand and twenty seven (1027) Seventeenth district
and third section: all of which lie in what was originally
Cherokee County be sold by my Executors to pay all my
last debts, and if more than sufficient for this purpose

Caes County³ J. Levi Spencer of said State and
County, being of advanced age, and knowing that I must
shortly depart from this world, and being also of weak body, but
sound mind, deem it right and proper that I should make a disposition
of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me
I therefore make this my last Will an Testament, hereby revoking and
annulling all others heretofore made by me.

Item 1st I desire ^{and direct} that my body be buried in a decent and Christianlike
manner suitable to my circumstances and condition. My soul, I trust,
shall return to rest with God, who gave it, as I hope for eternal
salvation, through the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, whose
religion I have professed, and I humbly trust, enjoyed for many
years. (I thank you.) I desire and direct that all my just debts be
paid without delay by my Executor or administrator hereinafter to be named.
Item 2nd I give and devise to my beloved son Thomas Spencer of the County
and State aforesaid, one quarter section of land containing forty
acres, situate, lying and being in the County of McMinn and State
of Tennessee, and situate in the first range west of the Meridian,
second Township, twenty second section, and of the south side
of the south east quarter of said section, beginning at the
south east corner of said quarter section, with all the rights, im-
munities and appurtenances to said quarter section of land, in any
wise appertaining or belonging free from all charge or limita-
whichever, to his own proper use, benefit and behoof forever
with full power to dispose of the same at any time that he may think
proper. I also give and bequeath to my said son Thomas Spencer,
in the same unrecurred manner, one certain note of hand under
seal, and reads as follows, to wit Three years after date I promise
to pay Levi Spencer four hundred and fifty dollars in current
State Bank Notes, with interest from the date to be paid
yearly, it being for value received, of him as witness my hand
and seal, this the 29th day of March 1841, and signed John H. Spencer
and tested by J. H. Horman, which note was given ^{marks} for
