(4th) I desire that my land should be leased and rented to the
 best advantage by my Executor, & the proceeds to be applied to the
 support & education of my children, and the support of my wife
 as my children arrive at the age of twenty one, I desire that they
 should receive an equal share of my estate.

(5th) I nominate and appoint _____ as my Executor.

My last will and Testament, made of my own will and accord,

1st After all my just debts are paid, I want my beloved daughter
Cynthia Adeline, to have a Negro boy Green, to be valued and if
the valuation does not amount to 550 dollars, for that amount to
be made up to her in money or other property such as she wants.
(2nd) I want my beloved son Samuel S. Chandler to have a
Negro boy Levi to be valued when said Samuel arrives to the
age of Eighteen years old and if the said Levi is not valued in
six hundred dollars, the said Samuel shall have the said Levi
