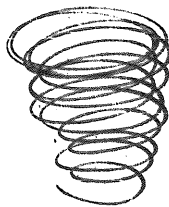


Georgia In the name of God Amen I James Talburt of the State and
 Bartow County I James Talburt of the State and
 County of Bartow being now of sound and disposing
 mind and full in Body, and knowing that it is
 appointed for all men to die, and in view of my
 approaching dissolution I do hereby make or make
 and constitute this to be my last Will and
 Testament. First of all I commend my Soul to
 God who gave it, and my body to be buried in a
 decent manner. 1st To my beloved Wife Mary E
 Talburt I will and bequeath the following property
 To One Lot of Land whereon Mr White now lives
 No (324) Two hundred and twenty four in the fifth
 District and third Section. A Negro girl named
 Mariah about thirteen years old, and a Negro Boy
 Henry about thirteen years old, also all of the House
 hold and Kitchen furniture except one Bed and
 furniture, and two cows and calves of her choice
 and all of my present growing Crops, and all of my
 Hays, and a Horse of her choice. her Sables and
 Bredals, and all of my farming Tools, and a goring
 of any description, and to hold possession when
 I now live until the first day of January 1852.
 all next year, and my heart and Obed, and
 what money I have on hand, Some two hundred
 and fifty or three hundred dollars. And to my
 youngest daughter Leheroke D Talburt I will and
 bequeath the Sum of One thousand dollars cash
 and to my daughter Leanne Dagg I will and
 bequeath the Lot of Land I now live on No 389 in
 the 5th District and third Section to have possession
 of on the first day of January 1852, also a negro girl
 about nine years old. And to my Son Benjamin
 D Talburt I will and bequeath one Lot of Land
 where he now lives No (324) Two hundred and
 twenty four in the 33rd County third District and
 Second Section. and four hundred dollars which
 I have paid him making him One thousand
 dollars with the Land. To my Son Andrew
 D Talburt I will and bequeath Lot of Land
 No (389) Two hundred and Eighty nine in the
 twenty third District and Second Section.

Dollars, and a twenty five dollars in Cash, And
to my three Sons John Talbot William C Talbot
and George W Talbot that is to their Lawful
heirs I will and bequeath equally to their heirs
all of the tract of Land they are now living on
in Bartow County being about 227 Acre estimated
to each at four hundred dollars. to be a set out
of each of their Shares to that amount. The balance
of my effects property debts and one every thing whatever
belonging to my Estate to be equally divided between
James M Talbot and Louisa Jane Fagan
until they shall get the sum of four hundred
dollars each, and then the balance to be equally
divided between said James M Talbot and
Louisa J Fagan to her and her heirs, and
the heirs of John Talbot, William Talbot and
George W Talbot, and Two Dollars each I will
and bequeath to my son Greenbury Talbot.
And I hereby desire that Linsey Johnson
or William C Wyly act as Executor to my
Will. and I hereby revoke all other Wills hereto-
fore made. In testimony whereof I have here-
unto set my hand and seal in presence of the
8th day of September 1850
