

In the name of God, amen!

I, John Cuyton, of the County of Cal, and State of Georgia, being of sound mind and memory, and considering the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life, do, therefore, make, ordain, publish and declare this, to be my last will and Testament. That is to say, first after all my lawful debts are paid and discharged, the residue of my estate, real and personal, I give, bequeath, and dispose of as follows, to wit: To my beloved wife, the one third of Lot no 200. No Two Hundred, in the Fifth District, & third Section, Cal County, Georgia. This one third of the above named lot shall embrace my residence, and all the improvements thereon, together with all of my household and kitchen furniture, together with the three negro Slaves, named Hazar, Sam, and Perry, now possessed by me, during the term of her widowhood, and natural life; and after her death, to be divided equally among my heirs. From time to time, I have divided a portion of my property amongst all of my children with the exception of my son Jerney Cuyton, who, upon a final division of my estate, shall be made equal with the rest of my heirs. The property which I have given to my children or heirs, & valuation was named in the title given to them, which will enable my Executors, upon a final division of my property, to make all equal, share and share alike. I have paid some debt of my son William, they will be ascertained and deducted out of the amount, which may be coming to him, and equally distributed amongst the rest of my heirs.

Likewise, I make, constitute and appoint John C. Bonds and Joseph R. Hulmore, to be Executors of this my last will and Testament. hereby revoking all former wills by me made.

In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal the first day of July, in the year of our Lord, one thousand Eight hundred and Fifty Four.
